

DECLARATION OF THE CORAP MEMBER ORGANIZATIONS AFTER ANALYSIS OF THE CONTEXT CARRIED OUT AT THE ANNUAL MEETING ON WEDNESDAY, MAY 22, 2024

Meeting at the Center for Fertility in Kinshasa for their Annual General Assembly, members of the CORAP ("Coalition des Organisations de la Société Civile pour le suivi des Réformes et de l'Action Publique") reviewed the country's political, security, economic and social situation. This analysis revealed the following:

On the political front :

CORAP deplores and strongly condemns the failed attempted putsch of Sunday May 19, 2024. For the coalition, the only way to come to power in the Democratic Republic of Congo is through free, credible, transparent and democratic elections. This is why CORAP supports electoral reforms to improve the electoral system, so as not to give in to opportunists of all stripes, who might find a reason to use illegal means to gain power. CORAP demands an independent inquiry to shed light on this attempted putsch.

At the same time, CORAP deplores the fact that the country is being held hostage by a handful of politicians whose sole concern is their own interests, depriving the country of a responsible government that can find answers to people's concerns.

CORAP draws the attention of the Head of State to the worrying social and security situation, marked by the resurgence of war in the East, insecurity in major cities, and rising prices in all sectors. Such a context demands that politicians become aware of the misery of the population in order to put in place, as soon as possible, a responsible government to deal with the multiple problems facing the country.

CORAP condemns in the strongest terms the bombardments in the IDP camps in North Kivu, and congratulates the DRC Armed Forces and security services for their efforts to secure the population and their property, as well as the country's territorial integrity.

CORAP calls on the international community to address the crimes that armed groups, particularly the M23 and its allies, are committing in the DRC. It calls on the United Nations to expedite investigations in order to establish responsibility for crimes against humanity, and to bring the perpetrators before the competent courts for exemplary punishment.

On the social and economic front :

CORAP encourages the next government to make available the resources needed to implement programs and policies adapted to the population's demands.

CORAP strongly condemns the misappropriation of public funds and the ensuing impunity, while access to water and electricity continues to pose problems for the population due to the lack of substantial investment in this sector.

CORAP notes that, on May 9, 2024, ADPI/RDC signed a memorandum of understanding with the Nigerian oil and gas company Natural Oilfield Services Limited (NOFSL) for the construction of one of the phases of the Grand Inga dam, while the country had already signed several other agreements, including: the Exclusive Development Agreement with the Sino-Spanish consortium to produce 11.050 MW in October 2018; the agreement with the Australian firm to produce 40,000 MW and now the Agreement with the Nigerian company without bothering to elucidate the situation of the first two groups of companies. CORAP is wondering about the DRC's true vision for developing its energy potential.

Clearly, the electricity sector needs to be entrusted to expert hands. To this end, CORAP recommends that Her Excellency the Prime Minister take the following criteria into account when choosing the Minister of Water Resources and Electricity:

- A person with proven skills in the electricity sector;
- A person with high integrity, good morality and a concern for the well-being of the population;
- A person with strong managerial skills;
- A person who masters the rules and procedures for awarding public contracts, as well as for negotiating Public-Private Partnerships;

With regard to the Grand Inga project, CORAP demands that the government officially publish all agreements and conventions signed by the DRC concerning this project.

With regard to the misappropriation of public funds, CORAP calls on the justice system to conduct independent investigations into all cases of misappropriation of public funds, in order to punish the authors in accordance with the law.

CORAP invites the population and Civil Society to remain vigilant in the face of the prevailing situation in the country.
